It's really a hard choice. In many ways I do like the 50 B&M better for some things. I have used it a hell of a lot, and it's always the hammer. What it lacks in velocity over say 458 Lott--it makes up in diameter for sure. Capable of the CEB #13s 500 gr at 2150--460 CEB NonCon at over 2250 fps, I believe it is getting even better with that combo. Now, the 450 North Fork FPS and CPS combo at over 2300 fps is really enhancing the 50 B&M and it's 18 inch barrel, and 38 inches OAL.

I have used my 458 B&M the least I guess in the field, it did a fine job on buffalo in Australia, just could not ask for better. But I have done a hell of a lot of field work with 458 Winchester and 458 Lott too, so I am very familiar with 458. The .500s had more to prove--to me, and getting proper bullets for what I needed to do with .500 caliber, which required lot's of field work to go with the test work, so I have worked more with .500 over the last few years.

But nearly all this can also be done in the 18 Inch 458 B&M also--with the exception of diameter. Maybe more bullet choices and more cheaper bullets available in 458. But I have pushed .500 caliber now that we have some extreme bullets available, and coming is a 450 gr North Fork SS Bonded Premium! For serious go to work in the field bullets, everything is there for .500 for sure. I like both--but if I had only one to go to the field I suppose it would be the 50. I would not be under gunned either with the 458 B&M and both rifles are the same size!
