

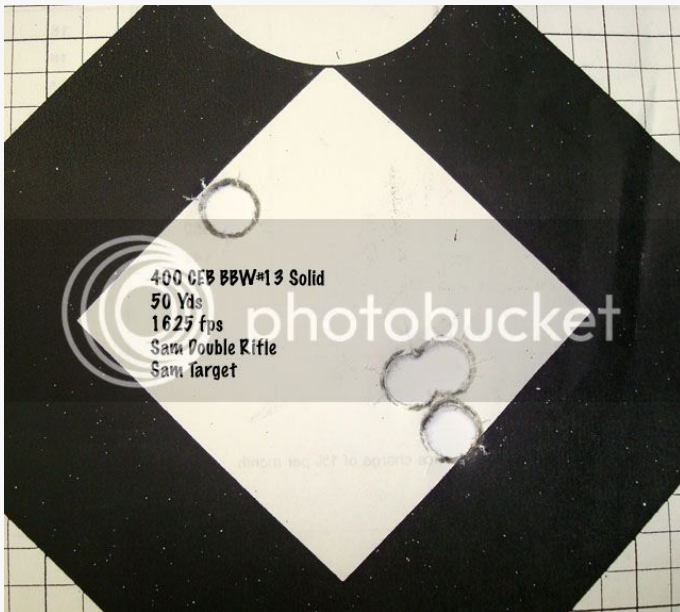

I think regardless the little gun shoots very good with the 400 CEB BBW #13 Solids!!!!!!!

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Well, finally getting around to getting the NonCons that Sam and I tested Tuesday posted. I have been covered up this week.

First let's look at the 370 CEB BBW #13 NonCon HP, matching NonCon with the 400 CEB BBW #13 Solid. We know from early tests last week this bullets lower limits on shear is around 1650 fps impact velocities. From a Marlin Guide gun, 18 inch barrel, and this particular load, that gives us around 100 yds that we can expect the blades to shear.



Our little 295 CEB BBW #13 NonCon HP is able to churn a bit more velocity as you can see, in the Marlin, but because of it's weight the shear is at 1700 fps impacts. Again, about 100 yards is as far as you can expect the blades to shear. This bullet at 22 yards caused massive trauma to the witness card! Close range under 50 yds, this is devastating, all the while giving excellent penetration!



We have the best bullets available now for 45/70 that we have ever in history produced. The North Fork 350 and 325 CPS (Cup Point Expanding) and now the 400/325 CEB BBW #13 Solids, matching NonCons at 370/295, it's never been better for 45/70. All will work through the Marlins without issue. Back in the day, I wish I could have been using these bullets when I was toting around a Marlin 45/70 on a regular basis, I might have gained far more respect for the cartridge.

IMHO, the 600 is the top rung on the ladder. Anything bigger, and the forces required to get adequate velocity for penetration preclude it from being fired by a human being!

When Corbin and I were doing the test work with his 600, most of it lower velocity, we hit 2000 fps a couple of times with loads, and with common bullets, it was not very impressive at all, not to me when concerning terminals. At the end of those tests Corbin got his hands on some 900 Barnes Banded, and at 1900 fps managed to push it's way to 53 inches, that was the best of show with that series of tests. Now while it's not all about inches, as 53 inches of dead straight penetration will do anything in the world you would want to do and then some more, but it had not out performed many things I already had, and no real performing softs or expanding bullets. We tested the Woodleigh softs, but had to get down to 1600 fps impacts before we could get 21 inches of penetration out of it, very very soft bullet. At 1800 fps we got 15 inches out of the woodleigh, nearly flat as a pancake. Some of the hard cast bullets we tested did ok, but nothing to write home about.

The 900 BBW #13 and it's matching 825 NonCon have impressed me. Seriously impressed.

Biebs, I agree with you 100%. There is just no need, and anything bigger than a 600 is, well, "OverKill" "OverWeight" "OverBig" "OverBurdened" and just simply "OverTheTop"

Now let's take a closer look! First, I have in hand the New .409 CEB BBW#13 NonCon HPs--Larger cavity so that we get shear out of them. These look great, compared to the first ones, with small cavities. These will shear, how low a velocity I don't know yet.



Also for the 375 HH folks and the 375 B&M guys the new 275 BBW #13 NonCon--Wider cavity to ensure shear at low velocity impacts. This one is good to go too, the other one is great with the higher capacity 375s, and even sheared well with the 375 HHs. This will do a bit better.



I don't shoot either of these calibers, please if you need some let me know, discounts available to get them off my shelves to make room for things more useful to me, personally!
