The very first animal taken with the 9.3 B&M and the 210 Raptor was a Wildebeast at around 50 yds or so. One shot, frontal angle, exited, struck by lightning, down on the spot, legs kicking upward! Unfortunately for some reason we did not get a autopsy on this one. Right now, I forget exactly why or what the circumstances were that we did not? But, I do have it on video! In fact, I have video on nearly every animal. Andrew did a spectacular job with this, as he did all of them while I did the shooting. I am not a video sort of fellow, but I wanted animal reactions to review, and got them. Don't be looking to see this anytime soon. I have not even figured out how to get it on the computer much less anything else--this is going to be some time!

I can figure out photos, most of the time however! The next two animals to take hits were two red hartebeast. I suppose 100-125 yds or so. Andrew having camera, binos, sticks, this and that, we forgot the range finder! I hit these from a tree I found a good perch on. Funny thing, there were two of them only. One right, one left. In my tree, there was a stick 2 inches in front of the muzzle, broke it off enough to clear for the hartebeast on the left, after I hit the first one, he also dropped immediately to the shot, never moved again. His pal on the right stood up, looked at him dumbfounded as to what the hell had happened? It was far too much temptation for me, so I moved on him and fired! Nothing Happened! He still stood there? In the scope I saw the bullet hit the dirt 25 yds in front of me--S**T--I hit that damned stick, he still stood where he was, I moved up enough to clear the stick, hit him with what I was sure a good shot! He turned, dropping in the rear, Andrew was sure I hit it too far back and said so! I was not so sure of that. He dropped in the rear, took off full tilt, behind a large bunch of brush and disappeared?

As we walked closer, behind that bush lay a hartebeast, I looked back at the tree, I was too far right, this was the second one, he had only made it 5-10 yards from being hit, perfect broadside, lung shot. The first one was only 25 yds or so away, still dead. Later as we watched reactions from taking BBW #13s we saw lots of animals drop in the rear end as they took impacts. Some of the animals that dropped in their tracks dropped in the rear end first and head second, very much like a perfect brain shot elephant does. I think that as we learn more about how these bullets react, or more so, how the animals react when taking this bullet we will see more of this sort of thing.

Here is Mercedes making sure all is in order before proper photos are taken!

I am not going to lie to you, both animals were lung shot only, no heart hits. I also don't know which lungs belonged to which animal either!

This is a fairly massive wound for one round from a medium caliber, 9.3!

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

This Oryx made a bad mistake! He stood still a bit too long, giving me a "POTS" shot! Point on the shoulder. Wicked shot, crunching bone, vitals, and this was the longest penetration recorded of the two Raptors tested. 500 MDM, 350 Raptor and penetration at EXIT was 3 feet.



Now case in point about the massive Entrance Wounds. Bullets do NOT blow blades on the hides, it's after entry. On this point of the shoulder shot below you will see just a .500 caliber + a bit hole in the skin and hide. Next you will see the massive wound inflicted and broken bone inside it. Now we have all seen examples where a lightly constructed bullet blows up on the shoulder, or hide of an animal when a conventional is run with velocity beyond it's design limitations, and they are ugly as well--but they do not go on to penetrate 3 feet either, and taking everything out in between.

The Tale of Two Wildebeasts!

I love shooting Wildebeasts! I suppose it could be that they bear a resemblance to my favorite game of all--Buffalo! Fairly tough critters as well. Nothing "Soft" about the beast!


Shot came clear, right on the shoulder, bang! Hit hard, took off, found dead 50 yards, stone cold.

Not much hope of survival I would estimate.

Now this next beast was truly a wild one. We are walking down the edge of a very large open type area. Beast jumps out, 50-60 yards in front of us, rather unexpected. Stands facing, nothing to get on but the sticks, and set up quick, take a quick shot with the 500 MDM, and I MISS! Flat out, miss, don't know why, how or anything else, just miss completely! Pissed at myself, he takes off running, it's open, throw another round in the chamber, line up, get in front of him, and turn another 350 gr Raptor loose on him! I hear the loud smack as the bullet hits, I see the rear end waiver as he continues to run, then like a skidding side to side car he is off and disappears through the brush!

CRAP! Too far back! Gut shot, no doubt about it! Now I have compounded a miss with a gut shot, and I am very sure we are in for the entire day tracking and trying to catch up to the beast! Why did I do that? I am not a running shot chap, especially getting out to 75 yards, or maybe even slightly more! 25 yes--75+, no, not on a beast at full tilt boogie! But it was so, I did it, now it's time to pay the price!

Off we go, we go for about a 100 yards tracking, no blood. Decide to turn Andrews dog Ruger loose on him and see if he can keep up! We turned Ruger

loose, and in two minutes much to our surprise Ruger was raising hell just in front of us behind a bush!

We walk up, sure enough, there lay the beast! Stone Cold Dead!

Further study showed the entrance had been a tad high, and just in front of the right rear leg. Bullet had traversed at a slight angle and exited just forward some of the stomach, I had thought in the field that it might have been possible the bullet had caught the back of the lung left side.



This was indeed going to turn out to be an interesting autopsy to figure out exactly what killed the beast! Back at the "Autopsy Shed", we found that the lungs had not a mark on them from anything, clean as can be. No wound, no blade, no nothing. The gut pile was a MESS to say the very least. As you can see from the following series of photos. You will also see parts that I don't know what they are, just gut parts! I think Kidneys is one, and some other things.



artery in between as I have never in my life seen as much blood on a trail in my entire life. On the hit, he took off with the herd in a dead run, but before long he was bringing up the rear. Blood trail 2 feet wide, continuous, I don't think you could put your hand down without being in blood. This went on much further than I thought it could have, 75 to maybe a 100 yards and he was completely bleed out. I did not get an autopsy on this zebra.



Last animal on the trip--Another Beast! He made a bad mistake, he stood still just a bit too long and I was able to lock in the 500 MDM on his shoulder! I always wrap in my sling, and the rifle was solid as if it were on the bench. Impact was hard, and the chase was about 20-25 yards before he took the final dive. I quick and good ending for all.







With this I conclude the thin skinned plains game study with the 9.3 B&M and the 210 ESP Raptor and the 500 MDM and the 350 ESP Raptor.
